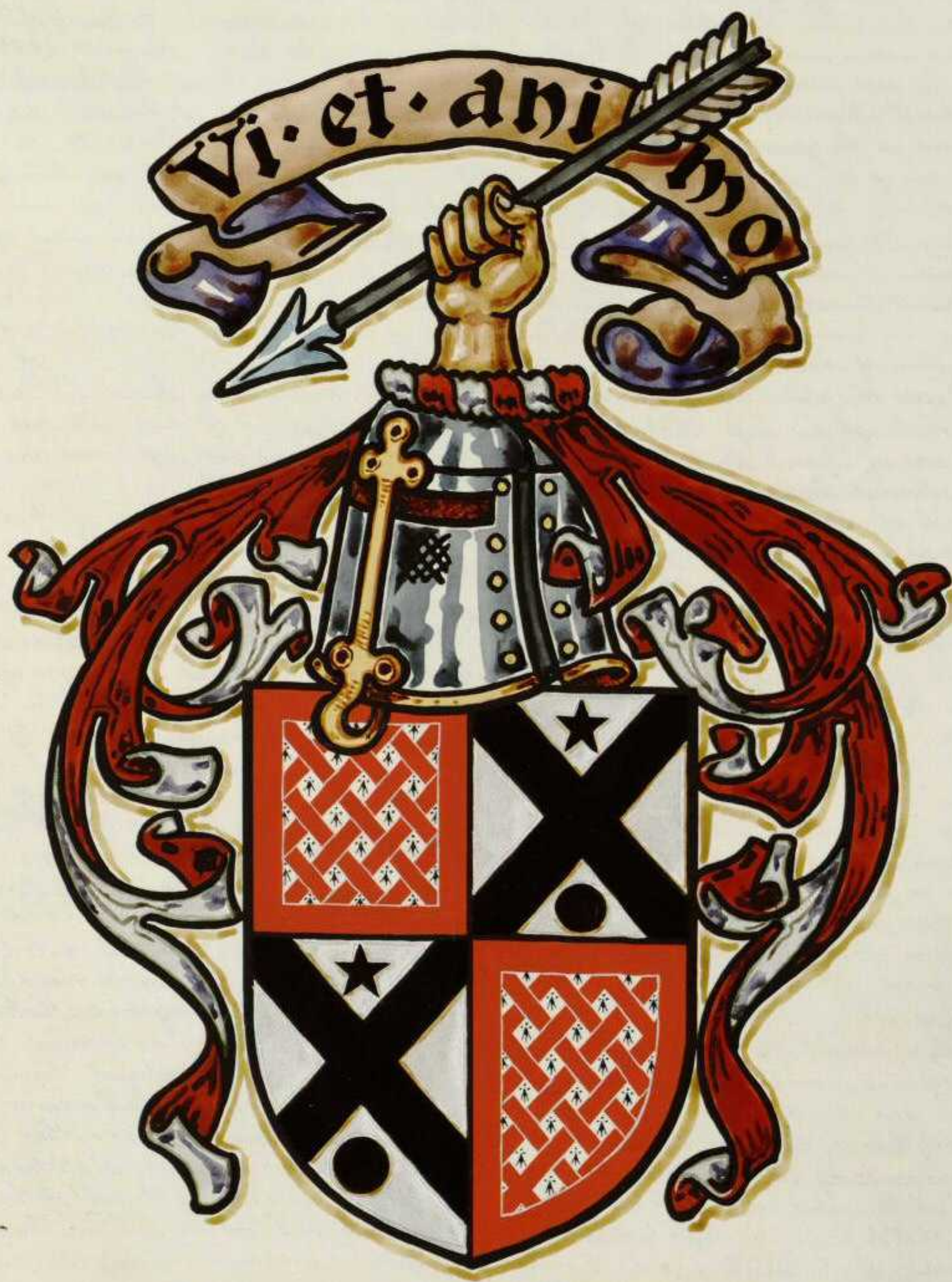

Andrew Jameson McCulloch younger of Ardwall, in the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright Esquire having by Petition to the Lord Lyon King of Arms of date the seventh day of June current Represented that he is the eldest son of Andrew Jameson Esquire Advocate Sheriff of Perthshire by his wife Christian Robieson eldest daughter of John Gordon Brown of Liverpool and Janet his wife daughter of James Murray McCulloch of Ardwall in the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright: that the said James Murray McCulloch who married Christian daughter of Walter Robieson of Liddisgreen in the County of Inverclyde was the second son of David McCulloch of Ardwall who died in the year 1793 by Janet his wife daughter of Robert Rae Corsane of Muckle Knott that David McCulloch of Ardwall eldest son of the said James Murray McCulloch of Ardwall died unmarried in the year 1858: that Walter McCulloch of Ardwall, Writer to the Signet, second son of the said James Murray McCulloch died unmarried on twenty fifth March 1842: that Alexander McCulloch of Kirkcubright third son of the said James Murray McCulloch died without issue: that there are now no male issue of the said James Murray McCulloch of Ardwall: that the said James Murray McCulloch of Ardwall succeeded his brother Edward McCulloch of Ardwall who died unmarried in the year 1796: that the said Edward McCulloch of Ardwall was the eldest son of David McCulloch of Ardwall before mentioned: that the said David McCulloch of Ardwall was the eldest son of Edward McCulloch of Ardwall by Janet McCulloch of Kirkcubright his wife: that the said Edward McCulloch of Ardwall was the eldest son of David McCulloch of Ardwall by Isobel his first wife second daughter and ultimate heiress of Edward Maxwell of Skells: that the said David McCulloch of Ardwall succeeded his elder brother William McCulloch of Ardwall who died in or about the year 1696: that the said William McCulloch of Ardwall was the eldest son of William McCulloch of Nether Ardwall by Isobel Crawford his wife: that the said William McCulloch of Nether Ardwall was the eldest son of Thomas McCulloch of Nether Ardwall by Agnes Geddes his wife: that the said Thomas McCulloch of Nether Ardwall was the eldest son of William McCulloch of Nether Ardwall by Margaret Muir his wife: that the said William McCulloch of Nether Ardwall is called *mostrum condanguineum* by William McCulloch of Myletoun and Cardines in a Charter by him and Mary McCulloch his spouse of the lands of Nether Ardwall, dated twelfth January 1584 in favor of the said William McCulloch: that the Arms of the family of McCulloch of Myletoun were recorded in the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland in terms of the Act of Parliament 1672 cap. 47 by Sir Godfrey McCulloch of Myletoun in or about the said year: that the Petitioner's mother the said Christian Robieson McCulloch Jameson succeeded her uncle Walter McCulloch of Ardwall in the estate of Ardwall in the year 1892 under and by virtue of a Disposition and Sale by Edward McCulloch of Ardwall, dated twenty third November 1752 and registered in the Register of Deeds seventh March 1758: that by the said Disposition and Sale it is provided that the heir female succeeding to the right of the Lands and Estate above mentioned shall be holden and obliged to marry a Gentleman of the name or at least who shall assume and constantly bear the surname and designation of McCulloch of Ardwall and none other and bear and constantly use the Arms of the family of McCulloch of Ardwall and that all the heirs of entail whether male or female or the descendants of their Bodies succeeding to the right of the said Lands shall be holden and obliged to assume and constantly use and bear my surname Arms and designation of McCulloch of Ardwall as their own proper surname Arms and designation and no other in all time thereafter: that the Petitioner being heir apparent in the said lands of Ardwall has assumed the name and designation of McCulloch in place of his paternal name of Jameson and is now known as Andrew Jameson McCulloch younger of Ardwall: And the said Petitioner having prayed that the said Arms might be matriculated of new in his own name in the said Public Register with a suitable difference and quarterly with the Arms of Maxwell of Skells the Lord Lyon King of Arms by Interlocutor of this date Granted Warrant to the Lyon Clerk to matriculate in the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland in name of the Petitioner Andrew Jameson McCulloch younger of Ardwall Esquire the following **Ensigns Armorial** viz. Quarterly first and fourth Ermine frettle Bulls within a Bordure of the last: Second and third Argent a Saltire between a Mullet in chief and a Roundel in base, all Sable. Above the Shield is placed a Helmet befitting his Degree with a Mantling Sable doubled Argent and upon a Wreath of his Tresses is set for Crest a Hand throwing a dart proper and in an Escrol over the same this **Motto** *Vi et animo* Matriculated the twenty second day of June 1899.
